AUTHENTICALLY SPEAKING

Tyres. 21" and 19" Cross-ply.

Some important facts.

You are not going to get the same mileage as your modern car tyres. The composition is different and they are manufactured for low mileage vehicles, *That's the manufacturers excuse anyway*. To give added life to your valuable tyres there are three important things you must adhere to.

Tyre pressure, wheel alignment and rotation.

Tyre Pressure.

Keep your pressures up. Some people have their own ideas on pressure but the general aim is to have plenty of air in the tyre.

Fronts 32lb and rear 34lb, but this depends on your vehicle. Lighter for say a Roadster, but as the above for a Sedan. If carrying a load of passengers inflate more. People are heavy. If you rattle the fillings out of your teeth, your tyres are too hard.

Wheel Alignment.

Not a lot you can do apart from toe in and out. The camber and caster are set with no adjustment. Toe in at 1/8" to 3/16". Keep a regular check. Just a small amount of too much or too less toe in can make a big difference to steering and tyre wear. Run the surface of your hand across the tread to feel for any ridges of sharp edges. If you feel any it is not a good sign.

Tyre Rotation.

Some people rotate, some don't bother. I have rotated all my life (that's the tyres, that is) and I'm sure I get better mileage. Some folks go front to rear and keep the rotation of the wheel the same

way. Others rotate around the car. I have tried both through



the years with no apparent difference between the two. Keep unused tyres out of the sun in a cool place to avoid cracking. Not in a hot loft.

When installing a tyre on a rim, there is a line around the tyre bead to keep parallel to the rim edge. (Arrowed) This is very important. It must be

even all the way around. Tuck the tube in evenly adding a small amount of pressure to slightly inflate the tube. It will even its self out. Talcum powder is a good idea to avoid chaffing.

Old tyres are not worth keeping. If cracked or perished, dispose of them. The picture at right showing a blowout that happened on a driveway in the heat and luckily not on the road. The end result could have been really serious.


