Model A Speedster. built by Neville Eltze

While attending the Australian National Meet 2018, we were fortunate to meet the two Neville's. Neville 1 loaned a 1929 Tudor to Anne and I and the other Nevelle 2 loaned John & Sandra Olliver a 1930 Roadster with both these cars; along with the two Neville's leading the way in their respective Model As, where we drove from Horsham to Adelaide, where we entered into the Bay to Birdwood Annual run then on to the 25th Austrian National Meet At Murray Bridge.

While in Horsham Nevelle 1 showed us his next project from under canvas. (see below)

Some photos of Neville Eltze's latest project The "Two Nevs" (Neville Eltze and Neville Thomas), who between them have the great collection of Model As and 1930s Fords (I know of) drove from Horsham, Victoria to Kalgoorlie/Lake Perkolilli last September and reckoned it was a complete "wow" event.

The 306 cubic-inch V12 is from a 1940 Lincoln Zephyr. The fuel tank at the rear is adapted from a Fordson tractor fuel tank. In the tractor the tank lay vertically, whereas in a Speedster it stands upright. In Neville's case the fuel tank is for show - as he is using the original Model A tank ahead of the firewall.

He has fashioned a new bonnet that is 7 inches longer than standard. The radiator is a few inches forward and the windscreen a little further back - so as to accommodate the length of the V12.

It has a Model A Ford hot rod front disc brake set-up (specifically designed for hot rods). It has a '39 three speed manual gearbox with syncro on 2nd and 3rd. He is still sorting out the changes on the gearbox, but says that as it has so much torque you can virtually go anywhere in top gear.

A very interesting project - and given that Neville was a speedway driver for over 30 years - it is the sort of project that gets him going.

He is working on wooden panelling and also is going to fit some buggy steps on both the left and right hand side - no doors - and one will just step into it.

He is contemplating some sort of Model A land speed record next time they hold a Lake Perkolilli!





Brake Rod Anti-rattlers, Correct installation.

Disconnect rear rod clevises; loosed locking nuts and remove clevises; slide anti-rattlers over rods so that they are pushing against donuts toward rear of car; bolt to bracket on radius rods; reinstall clevises and locking nuts. Fronts are different - anti-rattlers slide on from eye end of brake rods, so disconnect from cross-shaft arm at center of car, slide anti-rattler on, bolt to bracket; reconnect rod at center. You may have to enlarge the openings in the front anti-rattlers so they will slide over the eyes.

A quart of oil is 36,500 drops of oil. A normal engine in the 60s used 1/1100 of a drop on every power stroke (1 quart every 1000 miles was normal back then) and if an engine drips one drop every 50 feet, and it doesn't matter how fast your going, (think about it) the engine will loose 1 quart in 300 miles.

This used this to illustrate that a drip was actually much higher consumption than a bum??

Burning Points.

Loose connection somewhere between cut out and battery, causing voltage to go beserk and burn points. Check connections at: cut out, junction box, ammeter, added fuse holder, (if any) Remove both forward 3/8" nuts on junction block and tighten both of the 3/8" nuts inside the box. Be sure ground system is good by clipping test light to gearshift, put point to middle of + battery post, step on starter with key off. No light=good grounding. Light on=poor ground connection somewhere. Feel each connection for being HOT! Loose connection=**HEAT.**

In regards to the condenser. The job of the condenser is to take the brunt of power from the coil when the points break to keep the points from sparking / burning.

In modern times in every other application other than automotive we call them capacitors.

Painting The Figures On A Fuel gauge.

Have the black paint in the " $0 - \frac{1}{4} - \frac{1}{2} - \frac{3}{4}$ F" markings disappeared?

- 1: Clean the curved sector with the markings really well.
- 2: With a tiny brush or toothpick, fill the letters with fuel-proof paint. I use a glossy black epoxy spray paint. It will take 2 or 3 coats. Do not worry about putting on a bit too much.
- 3: When the paint is really dry, wet-sand the sector with something like 600 grit paper to remove all the overflow paint.

Gas tank Welting

One piece goes from one side of the tank, all the way to the other side, starting and ending at the rear edge of the hood. At the sides, it runs between the cowl and the tank, and in the center, between the tank and that filler strip that runs right under the windshield. There are various tricks for getting the welting to stay in place. You will need to pre-cut holes or slots for the bolts that hold the filler strip and tank to the dash rail. You will also need to make some notches in the flat part of the welting to help it go around the comers. The last inch or so, where it passes under the cowl band, has the core removed, and it serves as an anti-squeak under the front top comer of the cowl.

Gearbox Shielded Bearings. (Main drive gear and main splined shaft.)

They cannot be perfectly shielded, and shielding not be a smart thing. Ford designed parts to take

advantage of the function. The front bearing does not matter much. It faces up and there is the throwout bearing sleeve preventing oil from going anywhere. The rear bearing is open to the 'U' joint. The grease forms a packing and the oil that leaks past will get into the U joint and then back to the speedo gear and the drive shaft bearing. So why seal the rear bearing?

The Benson Ford was built in the 1930s and used in the American Great Lakes to transport raw materials and finished cars around the bordering states.

The ship was also used by Henry Ford to travel and

entertain guests across the Great Lakes. Thomas Edison was a frequent guest on this beautiful ship.

After being decommissioned, it was left to rust for four years before the front part of the ship was removed and perched on top of an 18 foot cliff above Lake Erie, to serve as a vacation home.

The present four deck ship house is 7,000 square feet and includes walnut panelled staterooms, a dining room with galley, and passenger lounge designed by Henry Ford for his personal use while on board.

The ship house was originally owned by Frank J. Sullivan, but after failing to turn it into a hotel in 1992, Sullivan auctioned the building to father and son Jerry and Bryan Kaspar, who still enjoy relaxing there while taking time off from work.

It has been modernized with a garage, a game room, a bar, a state of the art kitchen, and four bathrooms.



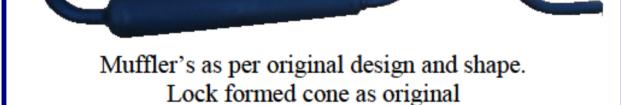
