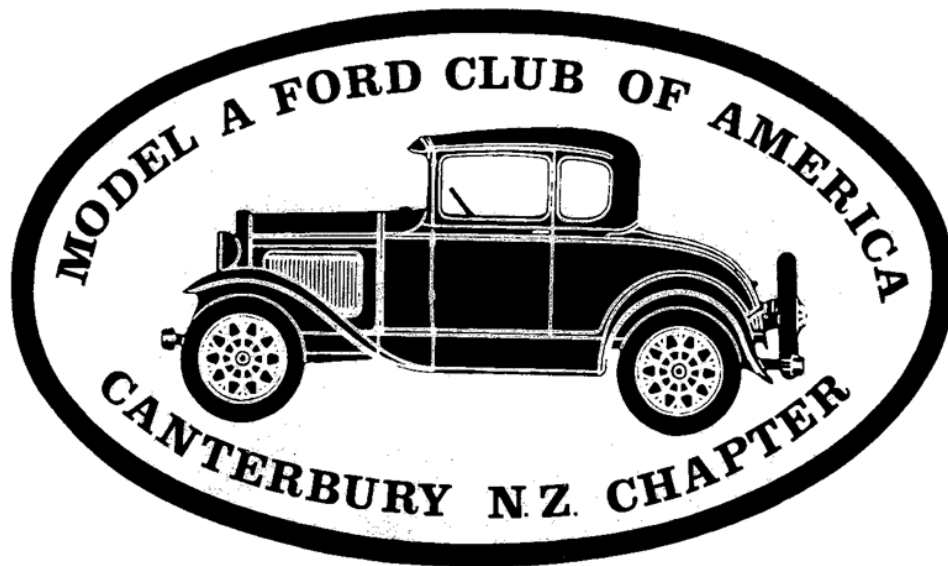

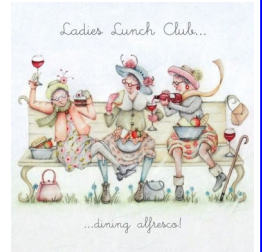

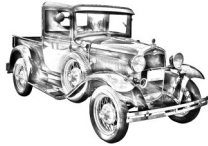

Past Events

September 26th—28th

International Model A Ford Day—Picton



Sunday morning was an earlier start due to daylight saving kicking in and taking an hour of our sleep. While some of the folks headed home from Picton, there were quite a few of us who drove down to Omaka airfield to attend The Wings and Wheels open day, before heading further afield. The open day was well attended by many makes and model's but we did have all the Model A's lined up and looking good. Model 'A' Ford Rims.

Your rims will either be 21" or 19".

Firstly we will cover 21" rims with wear and faults that can occur with use.

Problems can be:

- # Rusting of the outer circular bead edge. Difficult to repair and to balance.
- # Broken, bent or loose spokes.
- # Wheel stud holes slogged.
- # Out of round rim. Can be north/south or east/west.
- # Cracked hub rim, usually where spokes attach.
- # Rusting thin around the valve hole.

Best to find a better rim. New rims are available but somewhat expensive.

Spokes were factory installed to a hot rim and when cooled, contracted giving tension to each spoke.

AUTHENTICALLY SPEAKING



19" Rims.

Usually more robust than the 21" rim but similar problems arise apart from the bead rusting where there is no circular bead.

The 19" rim seems to have more of a problem with the stud holes enlarging, where a wheel nut washer solves the problem and is strongly advised on most rims.

Problems can be:

- # Broken or loose spokes.
- # Wheel stud holes slogged.
- # Out of round rim.
- # Cracked hub rim.
- # Rusting thin around the valve hole.

Best to find a better rim. New rims are available but somewhat expensive.

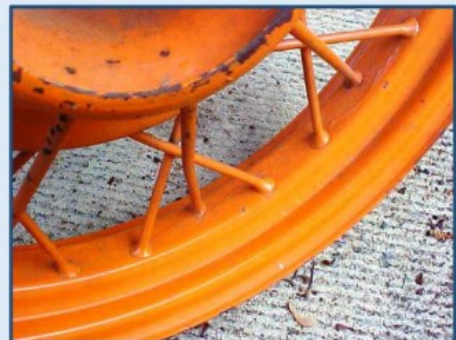
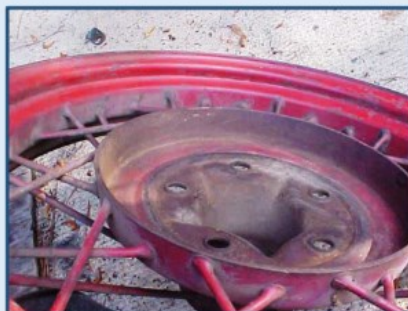

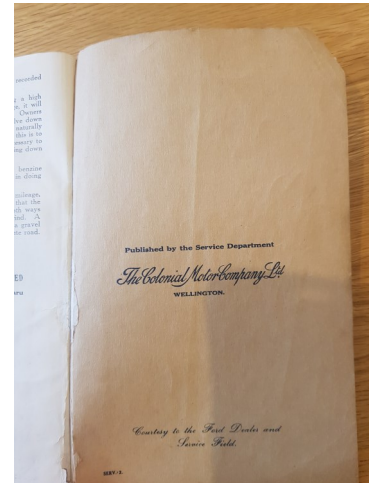
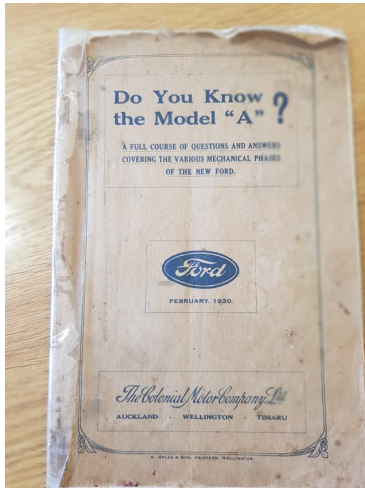
Most people think that all original rims were painted gloss black. That is not the case.

Late in 1930 coloured rims were available as pictured below.

These rims all have the original paint and are in good order.

DO YOU KNOW THE MODEL "A"?

**A Course of Questions with Detailed Answers Covering
Various Mechanical Phases of the NEW FORD.**

ARTICLE 5.

THE TRANSMISSION.

Question 10. Why is the cluster gear assembly mounted on a stationary shaft?

Answer 10. The cluster gear assembly rotates on a stationary shaft because the roller bearings can be neatly mounted inside the cluster gear assembly. By having the shaft stationary, it can be made a snug fit in the transmission housing, thus preventing oil leaks between the shaft and housing.

Question 11. What material is used in transmission shafts and gears? Are they heat treated? What can you say of the workmanship?

Answer 11. All gears and shafts of the FORD transmission are made of Chrome Alloy steel, heat-treated to obtain the required degree of hardness. As in all other parts of the new FORD car, the highest grade of workmanship is used in machining and finishing the various parts.

Question 12. What is the standard gear ratio of the Model A FORD in High? In Second? In Low Gear?

Answer 12. The standard gear ratio of the Model A FORD is 3.77-to-one in High Gear, 7.01-to-one in Second or Intermediate, 11.75-to-one in Low Gear.

Question 13. Why does the Gear Shift Lever of the new FORD require so little movement to change gears? Why is it so easy to operate?

Answer 13. Due to the high quality of design and workmanship, and the close fits between the various parts, the FORD gear shift lever requires little movement to change gears, and is consequently very easy to operate.

Question 14. What can be done to the gear shift lever to make it easier to get into or out of the car on the left-hand side? What precaution must be observed?

Answer 14. The lower end of the gear shift lever is held engaged with the gear shifter forks by means of a coil spring. By giving an upward jerk on the gear shift lever (when the gears are in neutral), it can be pulled out of engagement with the gear shifter forks, and then swung out of the way, giving more room for the driver to enter or leave the car on the left-hand side. Don't do this with the car in motion. The gears might jump out of position, making it necessary to remove the transmission cover to replace the gears correctly.

HOW TO BUILD A SPEEDSTER WHEN YOU ARE MARRIED

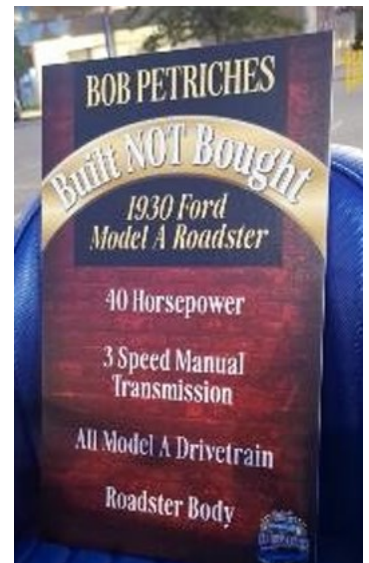

- Collect spare parts for many, many years before you mention your intention of building a speedster to Wife.

Tell Wife you helped a buddy whose terrible wife told him to get rid of ALL THAT JUNK. And you were forced to take it.
- Make your move by announcing to Wife:
- You finally know what to do with the frame, motor, transmission.
- You are going to build a Speedster.
- She has been admiring them for years at car shows.
- You have everything you need to build one. Won't cost a penny.
- It will be a good way to use all those old parts you have just laying around.
- Remind Wife about how much fun you have working together.
- Pull out all the hidden parts you have saved. Start cleaning, repairing, painting, and polish the parts. Leave them on the kitchen table so Wife can admire the shine. (Women are drawn to shiny things no matter what it is).
- Order the body kit online.
- When kit arrives in several crates, employ Wife to assist by using whatever arsenal you might have. Remind Wife about how much fun you have working together.
- Uncrate body parts and hardware. Do not be concerned that there are no instructions in the kit. You have never read instructions before, no need to start at this point in your life.
- Place the parts into what looks like a logical way to assemble them. Find extra parts you don't know where they go. Place parts into a better logical way. Try again. Study pictures on the internet. Try once more.
- Call a buddy who recently built a speedster, get a copy of his instructions. Have Wife read and sort parts. Inform her that the instructions are wrong. Make your own plans to assemble the body.

HOW TO BUILD A SPEEDSTER WHEN YOU ARE MARRIED

- Install wood floor, install firewall, remove firewall, cut firewall so it fits according to your revised plans, install, remove, recut, install, remove, recut, install. Continue this process until all the parts going through the firewall appear to function as needed. Re mind Wife about how much fun you have working together.
- Install seat riser, remove seat riser, make taller seat riser, install.
- Install gas tank stands, remove gas tank stands, make taller gas tank stands, install.

- Wire headlights, taillights, and turn signals. Test lights. Find problem with the wiring and repair.

- Install seats, seatbelts, windshield, and trunk.
- When Wife adds bird decals to speedster, adapt a stone face and just say, "That looks nice, Dear."
- Send Wife on the maiden voyage.
- Fix issues Wife complains about. (Always easier to fix than argue.).
- Add seven coats of polish.
- Remind Wife about how much fun you have working together.
